- Mr. Taylor made a motion to pay he McQuaide Blasko invoice in the amount of \$511.53 for services rendered through March 31, 2011. Mr. Schneider seconded the motion. A voice vote was unanimous.
- <u>Park & Recreation</u> Mr. Taylor reported the Park & Recreation Committee will meet next week regarding the Teener League Field. A recommendation will be forwarded to Council at the next meeting.
- Mr. Wilson reported the Arms of Peace Committee found a location at the Pleasant Gap American Legion for the Peace Memorial.

<u>Human Resources</u> – Mr. Provan reported the Human Resources Committee has had several meetings to discuss the Streets Contract. During those meetings they discovered that the premium anniversary for the life insurance and accidental death and dismemberment as well as

the short-term disability part of the contract has come. The committee requested that Mr. Stewart and Mr. Holderman get quotes from various companies. The results of that search showed a 40% savings. Mr. Provan recommends this be handled administratively.

- Career Link would like to provide a college age student to work with the Borough during the Spring.
- Mayor Goldman noticed there are a lot of flower urns in the downtown area and wondered if they would have flowers planted in them. The Garden Club will plant the urns with plants provided by the Borough.
- <u>Safety</u> Mr. Wilson reported that a grievance letter was received from Cpl. Robert S. Igoe in regards to salary calculation, specifically how longevity is being calculated. The Safety Committee met this evening and will establish a meeting with the Officer.
- The Fire Executive meeting will be held on Thursday, April 21<sup>st</sup>, at 6:00 PM in the Borough Building.
- The Fire Department Task Force meeting will be held on Wednesday, April 27<sup>th</sup>, at 6:30 PM at the Howard Fire Hall.

 $\underline{\text{Water/Sanitation}}$  – Mr. Beigle reported the April 5, 2011 Authority meeting minutes are in the packet for review.

- Mr. Stewart reported as part of the Weis Market project Weis was required to install a 10" line in front of their development. The rest of the line remains 6" and the Borough is searching for funding to upsize that line to 10". The agreement to serve Weis with water will be finalized.
- <u>Streets</u> Mr. DeCusati reported the Sidewalk Ordinance will be advertised. Once public feedback is obtained on it action will be taken.
- Mr. Holderman reported street cleaning is being conducted. He requested the residents help by moving their vehicles during the designated time so the streets can be cleaned efficiently.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

- Mr. Taylor reported refuse pickup for Friday, April 22<sup>nd</sup>, will be picked up on Wednesday, April 20<sup>th</sup> because of the Good Friday observance.
- Mrs. Dunne made a motion to begin the process to open Spring Creek from the High Street Bridge to the Lamb Street Bridge for fishing. The steps are the request must be on the agenda for the Pennsylvania Fish & Boat Commissions' meeting in July, it must be approved and

must then be advertised for a month. Mr. Taylor seconded the motion. A voice vote was unanimous.

- At the Council meeting of April 4, 2011 Mr. Holderman provided Council members with a draft copy of changes to the Refuse Ordinance. He would like Council members to email any suggested changes to him so they can be incorporated into the ordinance.

- Mr. Halderman reported there is a bear in the neighborhood. It has broken down two of his bird feeders and there were paw prints throughout the yard.
