The committee met this evening to discuss an inquiry regarding a piece of property owned by the Borough.

#### FINANCE AND GOV'T PERFORMANCE: Renee Brown, Chair

Consideration of motion supporting swimming pool renovations with conditions. This was discussed during the work session this evening. A solution was discussed.

Ms. Tosti-Vasey moved to write a letter of commitment on the rehabilitation of the Kepler Pool for \$140,000 from the Borough with the expectation that the other three municipalities in the NVJRA also similarly contribute. This payment will spread out over five years;

Ms. Dickman seconded the motion;

Mr. Beigle said he thought the commitment would be set forth without the condition of the three municipalities joining in. Ms. Tosti-Vasey explained that it is an expectation not a condition. Mr. Brachbill opined that the other municipalities should be responsible for the pool as they have residents that use the pool and it is an important item for their residents as well as the Borough's residents. He stated that the Borough should take the lead and in that, is holding up to what was requested by the committee for the community. The money won't benefit the pool if the others don't contribute as well. If all do not contribute then the work most likely will not be able to be done and the pool will close.

The community needs to understand that the Borough is not solely responsible for the funds for the pool and if it doesn't open, it was not on the Borough only to keep it open. Mr. Beigle stated Bellefonte Borough Council Meeting October 16, 2017 Meeting Minutes Page 5

the scenario if three out of four get the funds together, then what would the fourth party be told regarding the use of the pool.

Mr. Holderman indicated that this is for 2019. The Nittany Valley Joint Recreation Authority will be applying for a grant. They will have to have commitment letters for their application. If funding can be had from another source, at least the Authority will know where they have to make up the difference and this will be added to the grant application. Ms. Dunne stated that a non-contributing municipality would still be a member of the Authority. She did not think anything would change legally.

Motion was repeated.

# **Finance Committee/Budget**

Mr. Holderman mentioned that there is a finance committee meeting on Wednesday, October 25, at 5:15 p.m. This is a quarterly police finance committee meeting. The remaining funds will be reviewed at that meeting. A Special Council meeting will be held on October 30 with full Council to go over the remaining funds in draft. If all goes well there, at the first meeting in November, the budget will be put forth for advertisement.

# PARK AND RECREATION: Melissa Hombosky, Chair

Ribbon cutting for the Liberty Swing will take place on Saturday, October 21 at 10:30 a.m.

Talleyrand Park Committee met last Thursday. It was a walk-through to see what would be placed on a to-do list for the committee and also some of the things that have been outstanding; i.e., problems over by the fountain and sculpture garden, and the edible garden. Things are in pretty good shape as reported by Mr. Holderman.

The donation policy was discussed. Brick selling was also discussed briefly. This should move quickly as the platform extension may take place next spring or early summer.

Mr. Brachbill stated that people have been playing in the newer fountain due to the warmer weather. There are some legal concerns regarding this. Mr. Holderman mentioned that this was talked about at the Talleyrand Park Committee Meeting.

Ice rink project will be reviewed by the finance committee.

Mr. Holderman mentioned that the architects for the two projects will be invited in to speak to Council. Most likely the November meetings will yield these discussions. The parking lot architect will also be in to speak about that project.

Ms. Tosti-Vasey had a question regarding ADA access for fishing that was discussed a few months ago. A pad was discussed. This will be discussed by the committee.

#### **HUMAN RESOURCES: Joanne Tosti-Vasey, Chair**

There were 21 applicants for the part time receptionist position. 10 were interviewed. 4 were chosen for final interviews. Hopefully an offer can be made by the end of the week so that the person can start next week and have at least two weeks with Ms. Munnell before she departs.

# SAFETY COMMITTEE: Randy Brachbill, Chair

The unsafe conditions were questioned. These conditions leaned towards people removing things that were supposed to be in the apartment; i.e., smoke detectors. Renter- versus owner-caused violations were discussed.

# Ballot Referendum – proposed Constitutional Amendment amending The Homestead Property Tax Assessment Exclusion

Mr. Stewart stated that there is a proposed Constitution Amendment regarding raising the exemption on The Homestead Property Tax from 50% to 100%. This gives state legislators legal authority to go higher than 50%. There is no action necessary at this time. Ms. Tosti-Vasey offered that schools could lose funding from the state. The Borough Association's website did not mention this proposal.

Ms. Tosti-Vasey mentioned another amendment proposed for the City of Philadelphia but voted on by the entire state – getting rid of the traffic courts in Philadelphia.

Mr. Brachbill discussed the Legislative Action Alert; i.e., what legislation is coming up for vote.

Planning Commission is looking at the need for monopoles. Council will be getting their recommendation after their meeting

Mr. Beigle reminded residents that trick-or-treat night is Halloween night, October 31, 2017, from 6-8 p.m.
