# Project 1: 108 & 114 N. Allegheny Street

# **Project Applicant: Albert Drobka, Architect**

Contributing Building: Yes; built c. 1923

#### **Architectural Summary**


**Form**: Part of larger three-story block of attached structures, all built together. There are a total of six storefronts, with apartments located above. Flat façade: no projections except for upper balconies. Flat roof.

**Construction materials**: Brick construction with cement, wood, and iron accents.

**Architectural context**: Across from the large Queen Anne style Crider Exchange building, visible from the courthouse. Within the downtown business district of mixed 19th and 20th c. structures.

**Architectural style**: Vernacular, with some influence from stripped classicism.

**Key Architectural Features**: Brick pilasters dividing sections of the building, repetition of form, wood windows with segmental arches above, monumental flat cement cornice.





# Project 3: 203 N. Allegheny (CCLHM)

# **Project Applicant: John Sengle**

**Contributing Building:** Yes, built 1815 **Character Defining Features & Setting:** 

Known as the Miles-Humes House, this building stands on the northwest corner of Allegheny and Howard Street, among a mixture of historic and modern residential, commercial, and civic buildings. In addition to being a contributing element of the historic district, the building is individually listed in the National Register of Historic Places.


The house is a two-and-a-half story, five-bay stone building with a side-gable roof and central entrance. The building's windows are generally one-over-one, with blinds/shutters. The house was moved from its original location back twelve feet from Allegheny Street, where it was set on a full basement and new foundation. A central entrance with paneled door, fanlight, and sidelights, with a similar tripartite doorway with balcony above, characterizes the building. Three gabled dormers containing multi-pane arched windows penetrate the roof. A two-story ell with a two-story porch on the south side and similar details to the main block is attached to the rear of the building.






### **Project Description**

# Project 4: 136 S. Water Street


# **Project Applicant: Christina Lewis**

Colonial Revival in fair condition. 2-story, 3 bay. Roof shape is flat with deck cornice. Exterior walls are concrete block. Molded cornice with dentils & garland detail. Windows are 2 over 1, double-hung







### **Project Description**

- Paint the exterior: Rookwood Dark Green, Renwick Olive, Tricorn Black
- Repair and paint the railings in Tricorn Black
- install four new exterior light fixtures: one to the right of the garage door; one by the garage entry door at the bottom of the stairs; two by the front door at the top of the stairs.
- Install new rubber roof to match what is currently there (the current roof is beyond repair.)






