Operations/Staff Updates:

- Armory building the elevator shaft construction, the ADA entrance changes and the fire sprinkler installation is out for bid. We had intended having bids due on April 17<sup>th</sup> with an opening at that evening's council meeting. Mike Leakey called and suggested a bid due date of May 1<sup>st</sup> to allow more time to receive additional bids. The bids are now due on May 1<sup>st</sup> with an opening that evening at the council meeting. Other work is being scheduled ADA ramp on the north side of the building; a new door access/fob system; a sound system for the large meeting room, etc.
- Personnel we have internal personnel moving to/biding on openings which started with the water department opening. We call this the domino effect. Eventually we will have outside opening(s).
- > Streets sweeper running and leaf pick is underway. We will be moving into painting.
- Penn DoT SR 150, South Water Street Wall Project work is underway. A status report (no new changes to the detour or schedule) was received and will be in the 4/17 council packet.
- Traffic Light at Parkview and Zion I have had conversations with our Penn DoT contact regarding the traffic impact study related to BASD's plans to build an elementary school along Airport Road. Penn DoT was waiting on the traffic count estimates related to the Armory/proposed brewery project to incorporate those counts. I reached out to Duane Reese, the owner of the Armory. He replied that he will get with his engineer and provide the counts. All we want to know is if Penn DoT will require a

We will continue to push for a determination so that we can start our permit/construction process. We had a zoom meeting with a traffic engineer to discuss a proposal for assisting the borough through traffic light design. We expect to receive the proposal the week of April 17<sup>th</sup>.

- Police Collective Bargaining contract renewal The Agreement has been approved/signed by both parties and is in the process of being converted to a booklet format.
- Big Spring Cover funding grant funds have been wired to the borough in the amount of \$1.8M. The Authority will be evaluated its options for a new cover over the Big Spring.
- John Montgomery Ward Ballfield upgrade Project the field was ready for play for Bellefonte's first game on April 11<sup>th</sup>. There is a small punch list of items to take care of to finish. I want to thank Don for his management, oversight and coordination between the borough, the contractor and the engineers.
- Stage at Talleyrand/performance center As mentioned previously, the group received a \$1M state grant. The funds will be held here at the borough. We have not heard of any updates.
- Kepler Pool at Governors Park/Nittany Valley Rec. Authority The group has also received grant funds recently and is expected to start the initial phase of pool renovations.
