DEPARTMENT NOTES: (Significant non-routine types of incidents, just a sample of a few, brief description of the incident and outcome)

* Officer responded to a fire complaint on Monroe St. Person was burning brush causing a larger than normal amount of smoke. Officer advised citizen of the burning ordinance. Officer stood by while citizen transferred the illegal fire to a smaller recreational (reasonable) fire. Warning given.

*Victim's vehicle was taken by someone known to her, without her knowledge. Officer put the vehicle into NCIC as an unauthorized use. Vehicle was located by PSP in Grampian, PA. Officer arraigned the suspect for Unauthorized Use of Motor Vehicle

* Stolen Vehicle. Officer was on a parking complaint and noticed a vehicle that was reported stolen out of Ohio. The individual was wanted for assault. Vehicle taken into custody and processed for evidence. Returned to owner.

* PFA violation- Defendant was released from Jail, has a PFA on her. She made several calls and visits to the plaintiff's phone and residence. Officer confronted her, found her to be under the influence of Methamphetamine. Took her to the hospital to be cleared medically for placement back into Jail. (as per CCCF policy)

* Domestic, mother / son. On scene officers were confronted by a verbally combative/aggressive 26 year old male, living at home. Was upset because his mother would not give him money to purchase medical Marijuana. Officers reasoned with the individual who was in somewhat of a mental crisis. Officers exhausted all techniques possible to calm him down to the point that officers felt ok about leaving him with his mother.

* Cruelty to animals. Officer responded to a complaint of several dogs left in an unattended vehicle with the windows slightly cracked. Vehicle was NOT running, it was 98 degrees out, vehicle was in full mid day sun. Dogs were panting heavily. Officer located owner inside a local business. Determined that he left the dogs in the vehicle for

over an hour. Owner was made aware of the consequences of his actions. Furthermore he was educated on the severity of injury that could have been sustained by his pets. charges to be filed.

* Suspicious activity at Talleyrand Park. An older male was taking pictures of a minor female that he did not know. The minor told the officer that he followed several kids around acting creepy taking pictures. She was visibly upset. Officer took her home to her mother as it was dark out and she was very scared. She was released to her mother. Officers put out a local BOLO for the individual, searched but not located. Officer talked to her and told her that it would be best to never be alone in any park after dark without a friend(s), and to always let parents know where she is and have her phone with her.

* A resident found a dead fawn on her porch. She called the PA Game Commission. They gave her a response time of 3 days. Complainant was upset to their response. Our officer picked up the fawn and removed it for her.

* Officer assisted STPD with a severe MVA near the Vo-Tech. Victim had arterial bleeding. Officer performed first aid on patient to prevent further loss of blood.

Use of Force: (how many and brief description of each)

PFA violation. Officer was taking a subject into custody. Subject pulled away from officer, officer used open hand restraint techniques, while the other officer pulled his TAZER on the subject. He was warned to make the right decision. He did comply and the TAZER was NOT deployed. Taken into custody without further incident or injury.
