<u>DEPARTMENT NOTES:</u> (Significant non-routine types of incidents, just a sample of a few, briefdescription of the incident and outcome)

* Child line report of a 5 year old girl being abused by her mother who allegedly threw the child against the house causing injury to her facial area. Under investigation. *On foot patrol near South Spring Street late at night, officer noticed two males screaming at each other, officer stepped in and prevented them from physically fighting.

Both warned and they left immediately.

- *PFA Violation. Protected female had a PFA protecting her from any contact from the defendant. Complainant herd a knock on her door late at night, she answered, the defendant mentioned in the PFA entered her residence and walked into her bedroom. Police arrived and took the defendant into custody for violation of the PFA. Defendant is an illicit drug user.
- *Complaint of an anonymous person calling victim telling him that if he did not send them cash, that they were going to put nude photos of him on line. He was advised not to do so as this is a well known scam. There were no nude photos of him nor did he send anyone any. Phone number associated with the snapchat account was a "spoofed" aka fake number.
- * A vehicle was reported to have left the scene of an accident in State College Borough's jurisdiction. Vehicle was located by BPD officers on Stoney Batter. Officers held the individual until STPD arrived to deal with her. Driver facing misdemeanor charges.
- * At 2:20 a.m. patrol officer was almost struck by a vehicle who ran the red light at the intersection of West High and Water St. Officer pulled the operator over. He was arrested for DUI with at BAC of almost triple the limit. Also the operator was placed into the hospital for a mental health evaluation. The officer filled out 302 paper work to do so.
- * Officer was at a red light sitting waiting for the green light. Green light came on, officer

had to wait for a pedestrian who walked out in front of the patrol vehicle. The officer stopped the pedestrian who stated that he was too engaged in his cell phone to have noticed that he could have been struck. Officer warned him to be more aware.

- * Report of a young man sitting at a table in Talleyrand. He looked as if he had been beaten up. Officer made contact and determined that he had a bike accident. His face had signs of injuries but were a few hours old and bandaged up. He was waiting for friends to show up and give him a ride back to his residence.
- * upset bank customer told the teller that the next time that she touches him money that he would kill her. He punched the drawer that opens to the outside drive up lane. She then called the police. On scene the officer noted that the customer called the teller a "bitch" and that he is taking his business elsewhere. Teller wished no charges however he was given notice never to return to their bank again. Officer made sure that he understood the condition.
