DEPARTMENT NOTES: (Significant non-routine types of incidents, just a sample of a few, brief description of the incident and outcome)

- * DUI suspect arrested and later reported that she was abusing her children. Two toddlers were being bathed in bleach, and two older children were exposed to using crystal meth via smoking. Charges to be filed after investigation is completed.
- * Potter St. resident called regarding a tractor trailer sounding its horn for no reason, disturbing the peace. Officer stopped the operator of said vehicle and warned him to use the horn only when authorized to do so by title 75
- * SRO informed of a student that possessed a knife on school property. Officer escorted the student to the office where he searched the student, taking the knife and placing it into evidence. Charges pending
- * Reported that a woman was seen with her baby behind a retail store and that the child looked malnourished. Officer on scene was also greeted by counselors who took over the incident to assist the mother who is known to us. The child appeared to be healthy.
- * Officers dispatched to an overdose in progress, Narcan and CPR administered, during the event there were several illegal substances, and paraphernalia found in plain view. They belonged to the person who called 911. Ultimately he cannot be charged as the law provides the caller immunity if they stay with the victim until medical help arrives.
- * An adult child took her parents vehicle without permission, when she was located the officer found her to not possess a valid driver's license. She was also given field sobriety tests as she is a known drug user. She was found not to be under the influence. Charged with unauthorized use.

* Officers conducted foot patrol downtown. Officer was training a younger part-time officer on foot patrol techniques and some of the areas to pay attention to while on foot in the downtown area. They crossed pedestrians and visited several retail businesses.

* Officers were dispatched to a domestic where a male was preventing a female from exiting the vehicle. While officer was detaining the male, he threw something into the bushes. The officers screened the female victim by using the lethality assessment tool. Officer had the victim call Center Safe while in his presence. Also, consent search of the vehicle provided drug paraphernalia. Warrant check of the male was positive. He was taken to MDJ office and placed into CCCF on \$5,000.00 bail.

A female subject was being taken into custody when she resisted arrest. She fought with officers until a TAZER was DISPLAYED, causing her to cease her assault on officers. She was taken into custody and arrested for simple assault. No injuries were sustained by anyone involved. A use of force report was completed by officers.
