DEPARTMENT NOTES: (Significant non-routine types of incidents, just a sample of a few, brief description of the incident and outcome)

*Officers assisted a resident who was deeply depressed and feeling hopeless. Officers spoke with the individual and got him into contact with CANHELP. Officers stayed with the person until a crisis worker responded. He agreed to seek help on his own rather than us commit him without his consent (302).

*911 no voice, officers responded to the residence, searched the structure, no one was home. Left a note on the door to let them know what had happened.

*While on scene with the above incident, officers got a call for a male who was walking on East Bishop St. wearing tactical gear/vest, and carrying a semiautomatic rifle strapped to his shoulder. The male actually walked past us just as the call from dispatch came over our radios. Officer took no police action as he was not violating any laws.

* Officers dispatched to a high school aged student who is having emotional crisis issues. Officers were able to see visible signs of her harming herself in the past 12 hours. Officers offered to get her help by going to the hospital. At first she denied help and assistance, however officers were able to have her go to the hospital on her own accord and avoided using a 302 commitment. She was taken to MNMC by officers.

*Civil issue. two high school-aged girls were having a disagreement about property and who actually owned it. One of the girls was moving from the apartment and a verbal altercation began. This was almost at the physical level when officers arrived. Officers deescalated the situation and brought an end to the disagreement.

* A male operating a vehicle at the 200 block of East Bishop struck two vehicles parked curbside on East Bishop. The operator was questioned about the amount of alcoholic beverages he consumed. He stated at least 8 but doesn't know what type.

There were no incidents in which officers from BPD had to use physical force in the performance of their duties.
