- * 25 year old male domestic with his 85 year old grandmother. He was arrested for Assaulting her via strangulation
- * Report of a male walking downtown wearing body armor and a handgun holstered to his waist. He said that he did not feel safe in this Country anymore. Noted.
- * Report of a neighbor burning brush. On scene officer informed the gentleman that he could not burn leaves and brush. Gave him directions on how to dispose of it properly. Warning given.
- * 911 indicated that CYS was on scene at a location in Spring Township, the male part of the incident was to be intoxicated and returning to the house upset, and possible armed. BPD showed up to help out Spring Twp. P.D as the officer was on duty alone.
- * Officers Pollock and Walter conducted foot patrol for "Bellefonte Under the Lights"
- * Chief was off duty , noticed an individual who had mental health warrant for him. Officers were summoned and taken into custody/delivered to MNMC for evaluation.
- * Burglary at Beaver Farm apartment. Someone entered an occupied apartment while the victim was sleeping. They took cash, medical marijuana, and some percocete pain medication. Investigation ongoing
- * A fight at the Omar bar turned into a pushing match when a person was shoved into the large front window. The window shattered onto the steps outside. No one was hurt. All was caught on video camera. Appropriate actions taken.
- * Officers on foot patrol in the park noticed a decent sized group of juveniles hanging out in the Gazebo area. They were all talked to . Officers asked them to pick up all of the trash that was on the ground. They did without any issues.
